PROJECTS AND PLANNING COMMITTEE

<u>Consider Small Dam Cost-Share Request Application:</u> An application for the construction of a dam was presented for approval. <u>MOTION # 6 – Luebben moved, seconded by VonSpreckelsen to approve</u> the Heitmann Farms, Inc. cost-share application for dams and to pay 75% of eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000. Carried by roll vote – 16 yes votes.

<u>Consider NSWCP Cost-Share Request Application</u>: This item was tabled pending additional information to be provided at the April meeting.

<u>Consider Urban Conservation Assistance Program Request from Deshler Public Schools:</u> An Urban Conservation application was presented for approval. <u>MOTION # 7 – Hoeft moved, seconded by</u> <u>Kenning to approve the Urban Conservation Program cost-share request from Deshler Public</u> <u>Schools for construction of a greenhouse in an amount not to exceed \$\$14,460</u>. Carried by roll call vote. Yes: Bredthauer, Bonifas, Glenn, Hoeft, Hoffman, Hoops, Kenning, Knight, Luebben, Paus, Schroer, Taylor, VonSpreckelsen and Wiedel. No: Meyer and Ochsner.

WATER RESOURCES COMMITTEE

The Water Resources Committee met prior to the regular meeting.

<u>Consider Barry Renz Irrigation Transfer Request:</u> One transfer request located in the Very High-Risk Area of the district was presented for approval. <u>MOTION # 9 – Hoops moved, seconded by Hoffman</u> to approve the irrigation transfer request of Barry Renz to transfer water from the S½SE¼ 17-2N-03W to the N½NE¼ 20-2N-03W with the conditions well G-159520 passes the water pumping requirement outlined for a new well in a Very High Risk Area in the Groundwater Rules and Regulations and that a test hole is dug in the receiving tract at least 1250' from the existing well and be assessed by a certified well driller to determine if there is potential of 400 gpm. Carried by roll call vote. Yes: Bredthauer, Bonifas, Glenn, Hoeft, Hoffman, Hoops, Kenning, Knight, Ochsner, Paus, Taylor, VonSpreckelsen and Wiedel. No: Luebben, Meyer and Schroer.

<u>Consider Database Service Proposal from Longitude 103</u>: Thad Kuntz of Longitude 103 gave a presentation on software being developed that allows producers to access their crop reporting data and includes the ability to track water use data and other data district's would like to collect. <u>MOTION # 10</u> – <u>Hoffman moved, seconded by Ochsner to allow the NRD to submit a letter of support for the WSF grant application that is going to be submitted from Longitude 103 for a statewide nitrogen dashboard project.</u> Carried by roll call vote – 16 yes votes.

<u>Consider Rule Change Involving Irrigation Runoff Controls:</u> A request to consider changing the rules involving irrigation runoff controls was presented. The committee recommended tabling the topic indefinitely.

Other Business: There was no other business.

OTHER BUSINESS

Hedges informed the board of the NRD Recreation Exploration Program.

Wiedel mentioned a letter addressing the rural water projects plans to drill new wells was received just prior to the meeting and noted there was no public comment on the agenda but urged each director to read the letter. Wiedel stated the project was approved at the February meeting and the decision has been made.
